Parish development; we are starting to move forward with the plans to improve our facilities in the parish. At the moment, the closure of St Bernadette's and finding a 'new home' in Sneinton for our 9am Mass is the focus, but we will also be dealing with the old church building in the next few weeks and months. We will not have bulldozers moving in anywhere tomorrow! These things take time to bring to a conclusion and we will take a staged approach to any developments. The old church is an expensive building to run and to leave it empty for any length of time would be unwise – so we will come back to the parish in the next few months with a plan of how to deal with it. We will also bring forward the provision of toilet facilities etc at the Church. **Whilst the parish is relatively healthy in a financial sense, we need to make a concerted effort to build up a fund to meet some of the costs of development.** To this end, we will be handing out envelopes for parish development in advance of a **second collection this weekend, 20th /21st August.** We will have a few of these in the year to help boost the reserves and enable us to make a start with some aspects of the plans. If you haven't taken one of the little yellow development fund envelopes, then please do so and Gift Aid your contribution if you can.

Thanks; We have received a thank you prayer card from Sr Aine from the City Hospital saying "*Thank you so much for all the heartfelt religious objects you gave to us for the patients at the QMC and City Hospital – God bless each and every one of you."*

Confirmation: We have a date for Bishop Patrick to visit for Confirmation; Friday 15th September 2017. Because of the maturity required for the Sacrament and to have a number for Confirmation that is able to fit in the church, those who will be in Year 9 or above in September 2017 will be invited to come forward to be Confirmed. Bishop Patrick has agreed that he will celebrate Confirmation for us every two years, rather than every three, so after 2017, we will be looking at September 2019. Early in 2017 there will be a meeting for all parents of young people who wish to be Confirmed in 2017. As already established and advertised, the expectation for any young person who wishes to be Confirmed is that they will have attended at least 8 of the previous 10 CatholicTwentyFourSeven meetings which happen every month on a Monday evening. Early in 2017, the young people will be invited to express their desire to be Confirmed. The remaining dates for CatholicTwentyFourSeven this year are 26th September, 24th October, 28th November, & 19th December.

Memorial Garden; The final touches have been made to the Memorial Garden in front of the church with some planters and hanging baskets added this past week. There have been so many comments from parishioners and locals about the change in appearance – what a lovely way to have those who have died remembered. Whenever you walk up the steps or even drive by the garden, maybe just say an 'Eternal rest' for your loved one who is remembered on the noticeboard? A big thank you to Pauline and Jenny Baptist who have made all this happen and to all those who helped by digging out the old shrubs, waiting around for deliveries of slate, painting the railings and other little jobs.

Parish Ministry Party – on Sunday 18th September, there is a party with Hog Roast and other refreshments for all in the parish who are involved in ministry in some way; readers, counters, cleaners, Eucharistic Ministers, SVP the invitations are going out over the next week or so, but if this is you – then 1.00, bring a camping chair if you have one and enjoy the afternoon. If you have not yet received your invitation, pop into the sacristy after Mass and you will find it there. When the lists of all involved were compiled, we very quickly hit over 200 people active and contributing to parish life – for a parish our size that is nearly 50% of the worshipping community!

FIRST FRIDAY COFFEE MORNINGS; The next coffee morning will be held in the Parish Centre, at approx 9.30am, after morning mass, on the 2nd of September. Everyone welcome to come along for a cup of tea / coffee and a chat. If you have an hour or so to spare, or if you are new to the parish, you may like to take this opportunity to get to know other parishioners and make new friends.

Friday morning Mass; this has traditionally been at 9.15 to allow for the school to come over to join us. There is no need for this time change in the future, so please note that all morning Masses will be at 9.00 unless otherwise stated. Because of the pressure in schools on teaching time, we will be providing lots of other opportunities for the parish and school to join together for Mass rather than this weekly slot.
