This week, Joe McCay, studying for the priesthood, arrives to begin his placement with us. He will be in the parish until July next year so will have plenty of time to get to know everyone and gain experience of priestly ministry in the parish. On his first weekend in the parish he will introduce himself at all masses.

Going Deeper; our Monday evenings for adults who want to learn more about their faith resume on Monday 12th September. This month, both Fr Joe and Joe McCay will give a presentation on; Ready, Steady, Ordain! What does it take to make a priest? A look at the whole process of calling, selection, training and ordination.

CatholicTwentyFourSeven. Our monthly meetings for young people of secondary school age continue on Monday 26th September, 7 – 9 in the Parish Centre

Congratulations to all our young people who got their A-Level and GCSE results over the past couple of weeks, particularly to Christ the King School who saw a 10% rise in the key measures of 5 A* - C at GCSE. Nationally results have dropped but CTK continue to buck the trend. Well done to them all!

Thank you to Rachel Byrne, Claire Grimes, Ann Whittle, Yvonne Gateley and James Dwyer who have all agreed to become Eucharistic Ministers – they will be on the training course over the next few weeks and will be commissioned in November for ministry in the parish and, for three of them, their schools.

Appeal for volunteers we always need more people to help out with ministries in the parish such as reading at Mass, welcoming, taking the collection, church cleaning, being on a counting team Come forward – support and training is given as necessary. If there is something you think you could contribute to, then don't hold back. If you aren't sure about negotiating the steps at Sacred Heart – e.g to be a reader – then it is possible to be involved in ministries without having to get up the steps. We have a radio mic! See Fr Joe or anyone already involved in the particular ministry to see what is involved.

Rotas are now on the Parish Website. There are no tel. numbers listed due to data protection. Some of the rotas are in a new format so please read them carefully, and if you are unable to attend when it is your turn please swap with someone else. The Counting rota has been updated as we have lost one team. **Also** we have Twitter feeds from Pope Francis and Bishop Patrick on the website.

Year of Mercy; September Corporal Work of Mercy is to Shelter the Homeless. The situation for people in 'The Jungle' refugee camp in Calais may have dropped of the media radar, but continues to be desperate. Many unaccompanied children are stranded and living in terrible conditions. For our Corporal Work of Mercy this month, we will work with Seeking Sanctuary – a small charity partnered with Secours Catholique in France who provide immediate assistance to the refugees.

What they need is toiletries; shower gel, shampoo, soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes - - basic stuff we take for granted, but in short supply there. If every family or individual in the parish could bring in one item during the month and put it in the box at the back of church, we will be able to get the supplies to the charity then onto Calais before the winter sets in. *About 'Seeking Sanctuary'. There are currently still over 5000 migrants in and around Calais (March 2016) and many more near Dunkirk. 'Seeking Sanctuary' aims to raise awareness about this situation and is organising basic humanitarian assistance through Faith Communities and Community Organisations in partnership with experienced aid agencies such as 'Secours Catholique'. Parish Ministry Party – on Sunday 18th September, there is a party with Hog Roast and other refreshments for all in the parish who are involved in ministry in some way; readers, counters, cleaners, Eucharistic Ministers, SVP the invitations have been printed, collected, emailed and posted where possible. Second Collections; these are for specific causes and charities and are mandated by the Diocese. Some are for Diocesan needs, others for national purposes and others still for international appeals. The ones remaining in 2016 are; September 18th; Home Mission Sunday September 24th; Walsingham Shrine appeal October 9th; Cafod Harvest collection October 23rd; World Mission Sunday November 6th; Sick and Retired Priest's Fund November 20th; Parish Development December 11th; Poor and needy parishes.

There are many other calls from various charities to have second collections, but the parish Finance Committee try and regulate the amount we have so that we are not overburdened. Details for each collection will appear the weekend before they are taken. Thank you for your great generosity in supporting all these.

This is a debilitating illness that not only affects the person but also the whole family. The Charity funds research into the cause, cure, care and prevention of the illness. Confirmation: We have a date for Bishop Patrick to visit for Confirmation; Friday 15th September 2017. Because of the maturity required for the Sacrament and to have a number for Confirmation that is able to fit in the church, those who will be in Year 9 or above in September 2017 will be invited to come forward to be Confirmed. Bishop Patrick has agreed that he will celebrate Confirmation for us every two years, rather than every three, so after 2017, we will be looking at September 2019. Early in 2017 there will be a meeting for all parents of young people who wish to be Confirmed in 2017. As already established and advertised, the expectation for any young person who wishes to be Confirmed is that they will have attended at least 8 of the previous 10 CatholicTwentyFourSeven meetings which happen every month on a Monday evening. Early in 2017, the young people will be invited to express their desire to be Confirmed. The remaining dates for CatholicTwentyFourSeven this year are 26th September, 24th October, 28th November, & 19th December.
