Closure of the Jubilee of Mercy: The doors of mercy in all our parishes and the holy doors in Mount St Bernard Abbey, Holy Cross Priory, Leicester and the Briars Catholic Youth Retreat Centre will be closed on Sunday 13th November. Each parish is invited to send two people to represent it at the solemn closure of the Jubilee of Mercy, which will be celebrated on Sunday 20th November 2016, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe at 6.00 pm in St Barnabas' Cathedral. The Apostleship of Prayer has been, for many years, the official way in which Popes have made their monthly intentions known to the People of God. Recently, it has undergone a re-creation, partly at the initiative of Pope Francis himself, becoming known familiarly as 'the Pope's prayer network'. It is a spiritual pathway, offering a simple way by which people can offer themselves each day in prayer; the traditional morning offering to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is still very much at the heart of this ministry. Pope Francis continues to involve himself in this work and takes a keen personal interest in what we do. The Apostleship launched a 'Click to pray' digital ministry on 4th March 2016; primarily an app for smartphones and tablets, this spiritual pathway is undertaken by a brief morning, midday and evening reflection; users can download the app from www.clicktopray.org and make their daily offering with the Pope and people around the world.

Bereavement Mass; on Saturday 12th November, we will celebrate Mass at 10.00 for all those who have died in the past year. We have invited all families who have had a funeral here at Sacred Heart in the past year – and everyone is invited to this lovely act of remembrance of our loved ones who have died. If you want someone remembered in particular during this Mass, take one of the memorial cards at the back of church and either bring it with you on the day or hand it in to be placed on the altar on your behalf.

October devotions; during the week, we will pray the mysteries of the Rosary for 10 minutes before the Mass or service each day.
