Service of re-dedication.

This coming Friday, 19th, we will gather at 7pm for a service to celebrate and re-dedicate our beautiful restored church. We will be joined by priests from around the city and some of our neighbouring ministers will also be there. Fr Eddy Jarosz will preach and our recent assistant priest Fr Paul Smith is coming back too. We will also take the opportunity to make a presentation to Mr Nigel Leaney who designed the colour scheme for us.

There will be light refreshments served afterwards in the Parish Centre and if the weather is good, the Sisters have allowed us to use the back playground - - - so if it is sunny – bring a camping chair if you have one!

Come along – let's fill the church and make this a really joyful celebration and have a great evening.

This weekend; Fr Joe is away at a family celebration 12 – 15th July. Thanks to Fr Frank Carvill who is celebrating all our Masses. Frank is one of our recently retired priests and they are very generous in helping out so that Parish Priests can sometimes have a weekend away.

The Canonisation of John Henry Newman Cardinal Newman will be the first English person who has lived since the 17th Century to be officially recognised as a saint by the Catholic Church. The Canonisation will take place on Sunday 13th October in Rome. Cardinal Newman founded the Birmingham Oratory in 1849 and, when he died at the age of 89, 15,000 people lined the city's streets for his funeral. Cardinal Newman is known for many great qualities, but is remembered particularly for the kindness and compassion of his ministry to the people of Birmingham. The Canonisation comes after a second miracle in his name was confirmed by Pope Francis earlier this year. Two authenticated miracles are required before sainthood and Newman has been credited with curing a man's spinal disease and is now said to have healed a woman's unstoppable bleeding. Cardinal Newman was beatified (the process in which an individual is declared blessed after a miracle is attributed to him or her) in 2010 by Pope Benedict before tens of thousands of people in his home city. Confirmation; Bishop Patrick is coming on the 4th October to celebrate this Sacrament. Any young person is invited to come forward – **they must be able to answer 'YES' to all four of these questions**Are you in Year 9 or above from September 2019? Have you come along to 24/7 a minimum of 8 times in the past year OR shown commitment by regularly and frequently coming to Mass at the weekend (at least twice a month) AND/OR been involved in parish life (like being an altar server)? Have you made your 1st Holy Communion? Do you want to be Confirmed? If you can answer 'Yes' to all four of these questions, then take a form from the back of Church and return it by the middle of July to Fr Joe.

Clustering of our local parishes: All are welcome and warmly invited to an open meeting at Parish Centre on Thursday 25th July 7pm. It is an opportunity to look at the proposal put forward by the deanery, for clustering our parishes. The proposal is that Sacred Heart, Our Lady and St Edward church and St Augustine's Woodborough Road will be clustered together with two priests looking after the 3 parishes (4 churches). Inevitably this will bring with it a re-ordering of Masses in this area and a reduction in the amount of Masses that can be provided each week. Come along, share your thoughts and opinions and see how the future of our parishes will look.

Care for the church; now we have spent time and money on making our church look beautiful and a fitting place for people to come and pray and worship – let's make sure we treat the space with respect and care. Some things that have been noticed over the past couple of weeks; snacks for children being consumed during Mass and being left on the floor, people sitting or standing on the skirting board, particularly outside St Bernadette's room, people leaning up against walls and in one instance leaving denim marks down the wall that have had to be painted over. It is not fair to cause this mess or damage for others to deal with – so let's think about how we treat the church and leave it for others as we would like to find it ourselves.

Sick and Retired Priests' Fund; after over 5 years of fundraising for this diocesan appeal, we have raised just shy of £80,000 – a fantastic effort. Thanks are due to Geoff and Sandra Giles and their team – they have worked so hard to coordinate this appeal in the parish and have done a brilliant job. Now that the diocesan appeal is ended, we will continue to have the annual collection for the fund, but that will be the extent of our dedicated fundraising. **The monthly tea and coffee allocation will now go to the work of the Briars and the book stall in the parish centre will go to our development fund.**
