Opening of Churches for Mass; the government has given permission for churches to open for public worship from the 4th July. Their guidance on this, and that of the Bishop's Conference came out on the 29^{th} June, a week after the announcement. It was discussed at length by the Pastoral Team for our three parishes and a decision has been made to prepare to celebrate Mass on the weekend of 15/16th August. There are several reasons for this; it allows us to take care of the extensive practical preparations necessary to open, it means that the work on St Augustine's roof should be completed so it can open too, we need to recruit a large team of stewards and cleaners for each church to fulfil the government requirements, over July, Frs Paul and Joe will be taking a short break as they have not had time off since Christmas. Underpinning the decision was the concern that the re-opening be done properly and safely and that we allow some more time to see how the virus develops. Leicester going back into lock-down has meant that churches had been open for a week for private prayer, but have now had to shut again, along with schools. Our concern is that the re-opening may be too soon, so in the interests of everyone, a more cautious approach is being taken. This approach is being mirrored in many of our neighbouring churches of other

From the beginning of August, information will appear on the website and bulletin as to how you will be able to 'book' a place at Mass – numbers will be restricted to allow for 2m social distancing. Booking will be by email or phone.

Church re-opening - Teams of volunteers:

We are hoping to open the churches in our cluster (SH, OLSE, SA) from the weekend of 15/16 August. The requirements for opening are very detailed and the safety of our parishioners and visitors is very important. We would need teams of people to be available during times of public worship to both welcome and monitor those entering church and to be available to clean the church thoroughly afterwards. Any volunteers? Please email us on the email addresses provided. Government guidance is that the 70+ age group should not volunteer.

Sacred Heart Parish Administrator; Ann Oliphant retires from this post on the 15th July. At last week's Parish Council meeting, Ann was presented with a gift of garden centre vouchers and Fr Joe and others spoke of her dedication to the role, going over and above what was asked of her, always working efficiently and with good humour and being a really friendly face of the parish. She has run the finances and general administration of the parish extremely well over the past 7 years and even though her work goes largely unseen, it is very much appreciated by Fr joe and the parish community. When we get the opportunity, we will say 'thank you' in the presence of more of the parish community. Enjoy the retirement Ann!

Think about it; On 8th July 1979, Archbishop Oscar Romero from El Salvador, spoke about the importance of Christians witnessing to their faith. 'If some day they take away our catholic radio station... and don't allow us to speak' he said, 'If they kill all the priests and the bishop too, and you are left – a people without priests – then each one of you must be God's microphone, a messenger, a prophet. The Church will always exist... holding up high the banner of the Lord's truth and justice.' 9 months later he was shot dead as he celebrated mass in his cathedral. He was killed because he complained about the treatment of the poor by the government. He was a martyr for the faith. The word martyr is a Greek word meaning witness. Do we witness to our faith?

Laudato Si; Pope Francis wrote this letter in 2015 and it was the first Papal Encyclical to focus on the environment and link care for our earth with social justice: **Tackling indifference and selfishness;** A sense of deep communion with the rest of nature cannot be real if our hearts lack tenderness, compassion and concern for our fellow human beings. #91

Hospital Chaplaincy; Frs Joe and Paul are 2 of 4 priests able to cover the QMC and City Hospital at the moment and are only permitted to respond to end-of-life calls for Anointing of the Sick. All other chaplaincy support is provided by the 'in-house' Chaplaincy team. Equally, until restrictions are lifted, the only sick calls outside of hospital are for end-of-life Sacraments.
